

Maxine May Rubendunst Bloor was born May 10, 1937 in New Haven, Connecticut to Max and Amey Rubendunst. She was raised there with her two brothers Bobby and Eddie. She attended the University of Connecticut, School of Nursing and graduated with her B.S. in 1959. During her career as an RN she worked in emergency and surgical nursing, post-operative recovery, as well as teaching multiple nursing disciplines.

Maxine married Dr. Colin M. Bloor in 1959 and they moved to La Jolla, California upon the establishment of UCSD's School of Medicine in 1968. While raising their three children in La Jolla, Maxine was an active parent in all their activities. She also contributed to the San Diego and university communities through the National Charity League, the Congregational Church of La Jolla, UCSD Oceanids and International Center, and the La Jolla Symphony and Chorus. She enjoyed playing tennis and piano. She and Colin traveled extensively with the La Jolla Symphony and Chorus, including several trips to Europe, a music festival in Canada and a tour in Bhutan. For the last 25-plus years, Fourth of July was celebrated at Lake Tahoe, with any and all family members and in-laws who could make it.

Throughout her 82 years she made friends with her warmth, joyous spirit and fun sense of humor. She loved spending time with family and friends, and was famous for bringing way too much food to tailgate parties. Maxine is survived by her brother Eddie Rubendunst (Mary), of Guilford, CT; children Nadine Wilson (Ollie), of Delray Beach, FL, Lindsey E. Bloor (grandson, Nolan) of Ann Arbor, MI and Colin A. Bloor (step-grandchildren Cambria Beauvais and Austin Pickering) of San Diego, CA; as well as numerous nieces and nephews.
