Meet the Soloists

Praised for her lithe and elegant lyric soprano, Carolyne DalMonte is equally at home in opera, oratorio, and choral music. Recent opera roles include Adina in L'elisir d'amore (Donizetti), Dorinda in Orlando (Handel), Mimi in La Bohème (Puccini), and Despina in Cosi fan tutte (Mozart). Miss DalMonte has been a semi-finalist for the American Prize: Women in Opera Division as well as the Oratorio Division for 2017, 2018, and 2019. A graduate of the University of Delaware, she also earned a masters in Voice Performance and Pedagogy from Westminster Choir College. In San Diego she sings with Bach Collegium and maintains a voice and piano studio.

Evangelina Woo was born and raised in Faribault, Minnesota, where she began her musical career as the accompanist for her high school choir at Mass. She began singing in college at the University of Notre Dame and was a member of the University Chorale, where she grew to love choral music. She graduated from the University of San Diego School of Law and is now a full-time attorney at County Counsel. She has served as an alto section leader for the San Diego Master Chorale, St. Bartholomew's Episcopal Church, and All Souls Episcopal Church. She has also sung as a member of numerous music groups in San Diego County, including the San Diego Pro Arte Voices, Sorelle, sacra/profana, Musica Vitale, and the South Coast Chamber Choir.

Mitch Rosenthal, tenor, moved from New Jersey to San Diego in 2012 and has been involved with many groups in town, including acting as Section Leader at St. Paul's Episcopal Cathedral since September 2012, Bach Collegium San Diego, the Folklore Guild, Willan West 2018, and Sacra/Profana. He attended St. Thomas Choir School, singing under Dr. Gerre Hancock at St. Thomas Fifth Avenue NYC. During high school he sang in the National Cathedral Choir of Men and Boys/Girls under Douglas Major and Bruce Neswick. Other positions held were with Immaculate Conception Church in Bridgewater, NJ and Grace Episcopal Church in Newark, NJ.

Freshly out of his residency at the Academy of Vocal Arts, Anthony Whitson-Martini, bass, was soloist in Vaughan Williams' Dona Nobis Pacem with the La Jolla Symphony & Chorus and makes role debuts with Russian Opera Workshop in Philadelphia this summer. In concert and recital work, Anthony has received particular acclaim in performances with La Jolla Symphony & Chorus, San Diego Master Chorale, San Diego Community Orchestra, and Point Loma Chorale Union. Mr. Whitson-Martini was a winner in the 2019 and 2016 Musical Merit of San Diego Competition and is a two-time 1st Place Winner in the La Jolla Symphony & Chorus Competition. Anthony holds an Artist Diploma at the Academy of Vocal Arts and a B.A. Music from Point Loma Nazarene University.

Messiah-Sing Tradition

Since December 1978 La Jolla Symphony and Chorus has given Messiah-Sing to the community as a celebration of the Christmas season. Messiah-Sing holds the distinction of being the first Messiah "sing-along" in San Diego County with its earliest performances at St. James-by-the-Sea Episcopal Church, La Jolla. The first performance was accompanied by Jared Jacobsen, then organist and choir-master at St. James; later performances were enhanced by the addition of the La Jolla Symphony Messiah-Sing Chamber Orchestra. Messiah-Sing became so popular that it finally "outgrew" St. James. At the invitation of Pastor David Jorstad, the community sing moved to Clairemont Lutheran Church in 1993, and remained there until it "outgrew" that sanctuary as well. December 2019 marks the twenty-fourth Messiah-Sing at St. Elizabeth Seton Catholic Church, Carlsbad.

Conductor's Program Note

What keeps us returning to Handel's Messiah year after year? Indeed, this is a work that has an unbroken performance history dating back to Handel's lifetime. That Messiah became an institution is without question a testament to Handel's unparalleled storytelling prowess. Much of the appeal of Messiah is displayed in Handel's masterful use of text painting to create an impression of a plot or narrative, where one is not present. Handel's Messiah becomes more than the sum of its parts; yet, each moment captivating on its own.

This afternoon's Messiah 'sing' serves as a catalyst for fostering community, bridging gaps, and for a brief moment we are drawn once more by Handel's musical genius. A community 'sing' of any kind, be it Messiah, a rousing church hymn, or the ubiquitous Take me out to the ball game is community music making at its best. It is more than the sum of its parts, each of us bringing our collective experiences woven into one rich community tapestry.

The final concert of the season will be presented on June 6 and 7, and will feature Gioachino Rossini: Stabat Mater.
