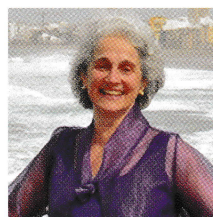

Steven Schick and David Chase lead our final program of the season. We open with Janacek's impassioned *Zárlyvost* ("Jealousy"), originally the overture to his opera *Jenufa*, and close the first half with the classical proportions and high spirits of Haydn's final symphony, his "*London Symphony*." David Chase concludes his fortieth-anniversary season by leading Cary Ratcliff's expansive setting of Pablo Neruda poems, scored for three vocal soloists, a virtuoso guitarist, chorus, and orchestra.
