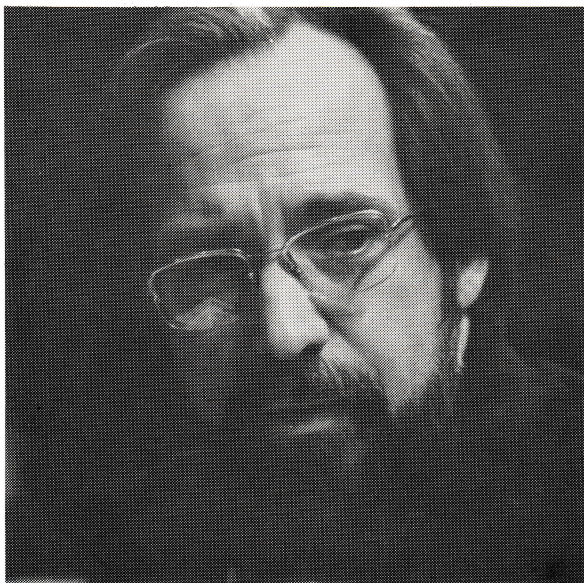

DAVID CHASE

DAVID CHASE has directed the La Jolla Symphony Chorus since 1973. A member of the faculty at Palomar College, he recently earned his Ph.D. from the University of Michigan. He has served as director of the Grand Rapids (Michigan) Symphony Chorus and has been a conductor of the Palomar Community Orchestra; this season he is also directing the Palomar Chorale. During the summer of 1988, Chase led members of the La Jolla Symphony Chorus on a two-week tour of Europe that saw them present concerts in Ottobeuren, Munich, Verona, Graz, and Eisenstadt.

WILLIAM ROESCH has recently returned to the San Diego Opera as its new Director of Education, spearheading a revitalized outreach program aimed at creating an expanded in-school educational program and bringing greater access to opera education for the San Diego community at large. He began his association with the company in its inaugural production of *La Boheme* in 1965, as Associate Artistic Director. For the next ten years he worked closely with the late Walter Herbert, during which time he directed seven productions both in San Diego and in Phoenix, Arizona. He has worked with some of opera's brightest stars, including a memorable staging of Donizetti's *Daughter of the Regiment* featuring Beverly Sills in the title role. Other productions have included *Madame Butterfly*, *Carmen*, *Il Trovatore*, *Romeo and Juliet*, and a *Tosca* starring Grace Bumbry and Justino Diaz of the Metropolitan Opera. Mr. Roesch has also had a long association with San Diego's Old Globe Theatre, which

he served as their first Associate Artistic Director, having directed some sixty productions for both the Main Stage and the Carter Arena Theatre. As a performer Mr. Roesch has appeared in three Globe National Shakespeare Festival seasons; during the summer of 1987 he made his La Jolla Playhouse debut in a production of Moliere's *School For Wives*. He is currently at work on the San Diego Opera's 1988 Ensemble Program which will highlight a production of Kurt Weill's *Down In The Valley*.

MARY OLIVER, a native of La Jolla, recently returned to the San Diego area from San Francisco where she earned a Masters of Fine Arts Degree from Mills College and worked professionally for seven years specializing in the performance of Avante Garde music.

Currently Ms. Oliver is a graduate student in the Department of Music at UCSD working towards a Ph.D. in experimental/theoretical studies. She is a student of Janos Negyesy and actively performs with Kiva & Sonor ensembles as well as being concertmaster of the La Jolla Civic-University orchestra and a recipient of one of the 1988 Association's Therese Hearst Scholarships. As a member of Sonor she recently participated in the Darmstadt Institute's New Music Festival in West Germany where she was a winner of the festival's student performance award and was invited to return in 1990 as a performer on both violin and viola.
