

Soundscape San Diego: exploration and remembrance



ith the excitement of our 60th anniversary year behind us, we look to the future. And our 2015-2016 season has some serious treats on offer! The series will highlight in the fall a set of concerts featuring music by our friend and winner of the 2014 Pulitzer Prize, John Luther Adams. We'll begin with Sila: The Breath of the World, a work we co-commissioned with Lincoln Center that will be performed in the Japanese Friendship Garden in September. Then we will open our subscription series with his Pulitzer piece, Become Ocean.

John's music invites us to listen to the world, and for the remainder of our season we invite you to do just that. "Soundscape San Diego: exploration and remembrance" is a reflection on the sonic life of this beautiful place where we live. We will *explore* through **Philip Glass'** piano concerto "After Lewis and Clark" and György Ligeti's *Atmosphères*. And we will *remember*, with beloved classical music like **Tchaikovsky's Symphony No. 4**, the **Copland Third** and **Brahms' Piano Concerto No. 1**.

We'll also think about themes particular to San Diego: from the grand Pacific Ocean in works by Adams and Debussy to a reflection on the 70th anniversary of the end of World War II with music by **Bartók** and **Shostakovich**. The season will conclude with a memorable performance, conducted by my colleague **David Chase**, of Hindemith's *When Lilacs Last in the Dooryard Bloom'd: a Requiem for those we love*, welcoming his son, Darren, as guest soloist.

Please join us for the start of our next 60 years! Listen to the place where we live, and join the musicians of the La Jolla Symphony & Chorus for our 2015-2016 season.

2015 COMPOSER-IN-RESIDENCE JOHN LUTHER ADAMS



John Luther Adams is a composer whose life and work are deeply rooted in the natural world. He was awarded the 2014 Pulitzer Prize for Music for his symphonic work *Become Ocean*, and a 2015 Grammy Award for "Best Contemporary Classical Composition." Called "One of the most original musical thinkers of the new century" by Alex Ross of *The New Yorker*, three of Adams' works will be featured during the LJS&C fall season, beginning with the Balboa Park performance of *Sila*, and including *Become Ocean* on the season-opening concert and the *The Light That Fills the World* in December.

Aleck Karis will be the soloist in Brahms' *Piano Concerto No. 1*. The program concludes with John Luther Adams' *Become Ocean*, which won the 2014 Pulitzer Prize for Music.

A study in colors, moods, and history. We begin with Ligeti's revolutionary *Atmosphères* (used by Kubrick in the film 2001: A Space Odyssey) and conclude with Debussy's magnificent evocation of the power of the sea, Le Mer. In between come Glass' Piano Concerto, inspired by the journey of Lewis and Clark, with soloist Lisa Moore, and the premiere of Erik Griswold's colorful orchestral work *Jeux à la fin du monde* (Games at the end of the world), itself inspired by the music of Debussy and Lutoslawski.

A multi-media concert in many senses of that term. The first half offers *Gotham*, a 2004 joint production by filmmaker Bill Morrison and composer Michael Gordon. Using archival footage of New York City, *Gotham* combines film, projectors, lighting and orchestra to create a haunting impression of that city. Stravinsky's opulent *Persephone*, which the composer described as a

"melodrama," sets a text by André Gide that tells of the descent of the goddess *Persephone* into the underworld and her return. For this exciting concert event we will be joined by Lux Boreal Dance Company, narrator, tenor soloist, and children's choir.

Andrea Fortier, our 2014 Young Artists winner, performs Bartók's valedictory *Viola Concerto*. Guest conductor Rodrigo Ruiz surrounds the concerto with two great Russian symphonies: Shostakovich's saucy *Ninth*, which got him in trouble with Soviet authorities, and Tchaikovsky's fiery *Fourth*, one of the most popular symphonies of all time. Guest conductor Rodrigo Ruiz began his musical education in Tijuana, Mexico at the State Conservatory of Baja California at the age of 7. Ruiz received his BM in piano performance at Lawrence University in Wisconsin, and his MM from University of Michigan, under Kenneth Kiesler. He has conducted the Berliner Sinfonietta, Lawrence Symphony Orchestra, Orchestra of Baja California, Mexican Orchestra of the Arts, to name a few.

Old World composers in the New World. Our season concludes with David Chase conducting an imaginative pairing of works by two European masters who came to the U.S. at the beginning of World War II. Britten composed his *American Overture* in 1941 for the Cleveland Orchestra, but it was not performed until 1983, six years after the composer's death. Hindemith's moving setting of Walt Whitman's elegy for Abraham Lincoln, *When Lilacs Last in the Dooryard Bloom'd: a Requiem for those we love,* is considered by many to be his finest work; with chorus, mezzo-soprano, and baritone.




