Our 62nd season samples music that composers wrote at the rich midpoint of their careers. In many cases these works acted as pivot points for their composers and became jumping-off points for new arcs of musical development in their later years. We open with what may be the most famous music ever written, Beethoven's Fifth Symphony, premiered when its composer was 38. The classic monumentality of the Fifth contrasts sharply with the steamy sensuality of Scriabin's Poem of Ecstasy, composed when Scriabin was 36. In between Anna Thorvaldsdottir and Bryce Dessner sketch colorful accounts of newer musical landscapes.

Symphony of Psalms **Thomas Nee Commission** In the Midst of Flux Symphony No. 6

Igor Stravinsky Kevin Zhang Gity Razaz Ludwig van Beethoven

Classical and neo-classical. Two radically-different approaches to the symphony: Beethoven's loving evocation of the Austrian countryside follows the stark beauty of Stravinsky's devout statement of faith, the Symphony of Psalms. These iconic works share the stage with two emerging composers. Kevin Zhang, this year's Nee Commission recipient, will compose a concerto for two violins, performed by LJS&C co-concertmasters David Buckley and Peter Clarke. Young Iranian-American composer Gity Razaz balances influences from two musical worlds with enormous sophistication in her 2013 composition.

One more re-imagining of what the symphony might be. In 1969 the 44-year-old Luciano Berio confronted the imposing heritage of Beethoven and Mahler and composed his Sinfonia for orchestra and vocal octet, performed here by UCSD vocal ensemble Kallisti. Also on the program are Beethoven's majestic Violin Concerto with soloist David Bowlin and the La Jolla Symphony's first

performance of a Rossini overture since 1973.

REQUIEM

Giuseppe Verdi

Guest artists: San Diego Master Chorale, San Diego Gay Men's Chorus



Verdi composed his magnificent Requiem in 1874, when he was in his sixties and thought that he had retired. His Requiem happened almost by accident: Verdi

proposed that a setting of that great text should be made by a group of composers, but when the others dropped out, he wrote the whole thing himself. Millions of music-lovers have been grateful ever since for Verdi's un-retirement. The symphony and chorus will be joined in this production by guest choruses and operatic soloists for the concert event of the season. Three performances.

Tailored for young eyes and ears, this free concert is a family favorite! The Young People's Concert features excerpts from the October 29-30 program with commentary from the stage by Steven Schick. Reservations required.

Guest conductor Michael Gerdes leads a perennial favorite, *Pictures at an Exhibition*, composed when Mussorgsky was 35. That should have been the midpoint of a great career, but-tragically-he was dead only seven years later. LJS&C Young Artists first-place winner

Carlos Aguilar plays Nielsen's *Flute Concerto*, a very playful (and a very funny) piece of music. Vivian Fung offers her own set of "pictures" in a colorful musical response to works of public art from the 2015 Vancouver Art Biennale.
