Tonight's soloist, Geoffrey Applegate, was a winner in the 1973 Youth Talent Contest sponsored by the symphony. Mr. Applegate is a senior in high school, a valued member of the orchestra and a pupil of Mary Gerard.

We are honored to have three of the composers of tonight's music in our audience.

Dane Rudhyar is our featured composer during this week's festival. Mr. Rudhyar was born in Paris, France in 1895. He came to the United States in 1916 and was a founding member of the International Composer's Guild. In addition to his musical activities he is widely known as our leading humanistic astrologer and has published many books on that subject; he is also a painter, poet and philosopher. He will give a lecture with music and there will be a concert of his music later in the week.

Derek Healey teaches at the University of Guelph, Ontario, Canada. Arctic Images was written for the CBC for the Vancouver Autumn Fair, 1971, and was inspired by five Eskimo prints with the same titles.

William Rice studied at Yale with Paul Hindemith and teaches in Boston. He is a summer resident of New Hampshire. This suite was written in 1968 for the New Hampshire Music Festival and is based on sheet music from the early 19th century in the New Hampshire State Library, Concord.

The next program of the Symphony, May 18, 19, will feature Alice and Eleonore Schoenfeld in the Double Concerto for Violin and Cello of Brahms. Also on the program will be the Hindemith Metamorphosis of Themes of Weber and a work for string orchestra.
